The illness and death of my father, profoundly effected me and will be the event through which everything else in 2010 will be viewed for me. I will always

be grateful for the pastoral care of Rev. Janet Lowery of North Springfield, truly a gifted pastor and valued colleague in ministry. Members of the congregation, family and friends, Kiwanis members, and community members all were helpful companions on the journey through the valley of the shadow of death. I will continue to work with my grief over the next year with my Dad's passing being the largest part. I know his memory will be with me as I walk others through that valley accompanied and led by our Lord Jesus Christ.

The second biggest event in 2010 was a surprise. A simple message on our outdoor sign recognizing our love for our Muslim neighbors, got regional TV and newspaper coverage and national exposure in a PCUSA News release and the Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary's *Mosaie* publication. As I said in the article:

...because we believe so strongly that Jesus Christ is our Lord we try to do as he tells us and he tells us to love our neighbors...On the one hand, I wish it wasn't news that Christians love their neighbors, but on the other hand, I think it really points out the necessity of the Gospel to the congregation and the community that's really desperate for good news. And that's what Gospel means: good news.

2010 was the year of watching Dr. Chuck Sandstrom ascend in ministry. From being challenged by memory verses at Vacation Bible School to climbing the stairs to the pulpit to preach a message on Sunday, his journey is an inspiration and a blessing to me and this congregation.

I find that I have recorded nearly 50 visits in homes and hospitals and over that many meetings outside of worship services, dinners, Vacation Bible School, and one on one talks in formal and informal settings, many emails, phone calls, tweets, Facebook posts, entries on my ExtraChristy blog mailed to the homebound, and emailed weekly prayer concerns.

Thank you for allowing me to be your pastor for another year. I dearly love the challenges, experiences, and opportunities for preaching, care and service. Let us Love as Christ Loved.
